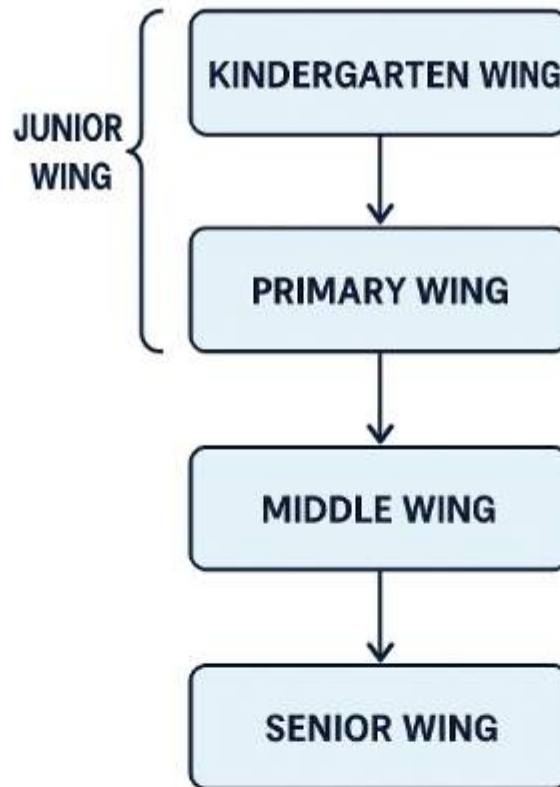

As we move forward into a new term, may we continue to walk together—nurturing minds, shaping futures, and lighting the path toward brilliance, one step at a time.

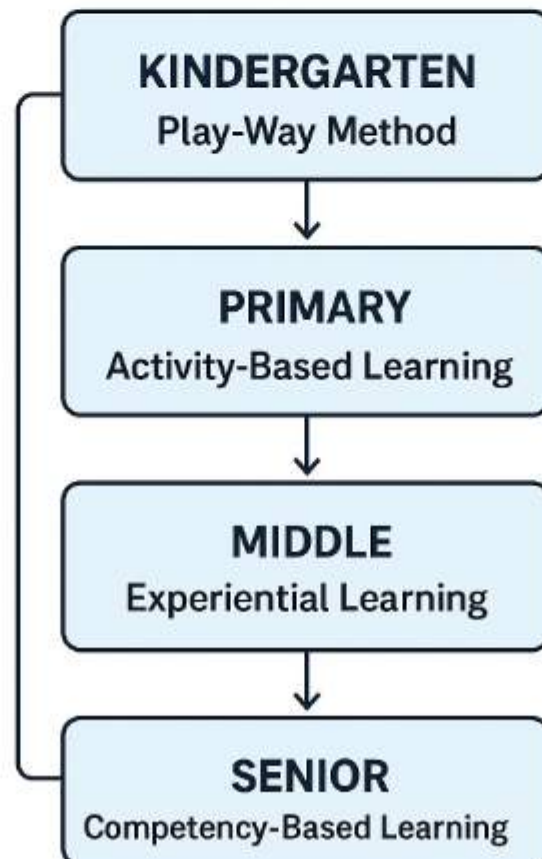
